ACT GOVERNMENT ACQUISITION OF CALVARY PUBLIC HOSPITAL BRUCE

In a <u>statement</u> Calvary National CEO, has expressed extreme disappointment in the ACT Government's unexpected and unilateral decision to introduce legislation that effectively dissolves Calvary's partnership on public health delivery in the Territory.
