## **SEASON OF CREATION 2023**

The <u>Season of Creation</u> (1 September to 4 October) is an ecumenical celebration, affirming our communion with creation and among the Churches. It was started in 1989 by Ecumenical Patriarch Dimitrios I. In 2015 the Catholic Church joined this event at the initiative of Pope Francis. The <u>theme</u> for 2023 is "Let justice and peace flow". The Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development has issued an invitation to Religious Institutes to a webinar for the Season of Creation (see *Events* below).

#### NATSICC-CRA RESOURCE: CROSS-CULTURAL COMPETENCY IN A CATHOLIC CONTEXT


